ABE programs and teachers must use curriculum that matches the demands of the CCRSAE for ELA/literacy from Levels A through D-E.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Habitually review the same anchor standard across CCRSAE-ELA levels A-E to understand the developmental continuum and use it to differentiate instruction according to the levels of the students in the classroom. 2) Track lessons and units to ensure the full range of ELA standards for a level are being taught. 3) Develop/adapt/use systems and templates to ensure that the CCRSAE-ELA standards and instructional shifts are the focus of instruction (<i>e.g., program scope and sequence; program unit plans; lesson plan templates</i>).
