Uses insights from self-assessments to identify meaningful student learning and professional practice goals that are clear, results-focused, and measurable or observable. Reviews goals, monitors progress, and makes revisions as needed.

<p>a. Written goals with a plan to meet those goals helps lead to success in life and career.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assess needs and identify a goal.</li> <li>• Describe what success with that goal looks like.</li> <li>• Identify steps toward the goal.</li> </ul>	
<p>b. Goals that are clear, results focused, and measurable or observable are easier to meet.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure that goals can be accomplished within a realistic timeframe, especially for part-time staff.</li> <li>• Consider strategies (such as analyzing student data) for determining if the goal attainment has an impact on student learning.</li> </ul>	
<p>c. Goals are based on student and program needs.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As a program team, discuss needs of the program to ensure sufficient capacity to meet those needs.</li> <li>• Analyze student achievement to determine what areas need improvement and consider the feasibility of learning new ways to teach to those areas.</li> </ul>
